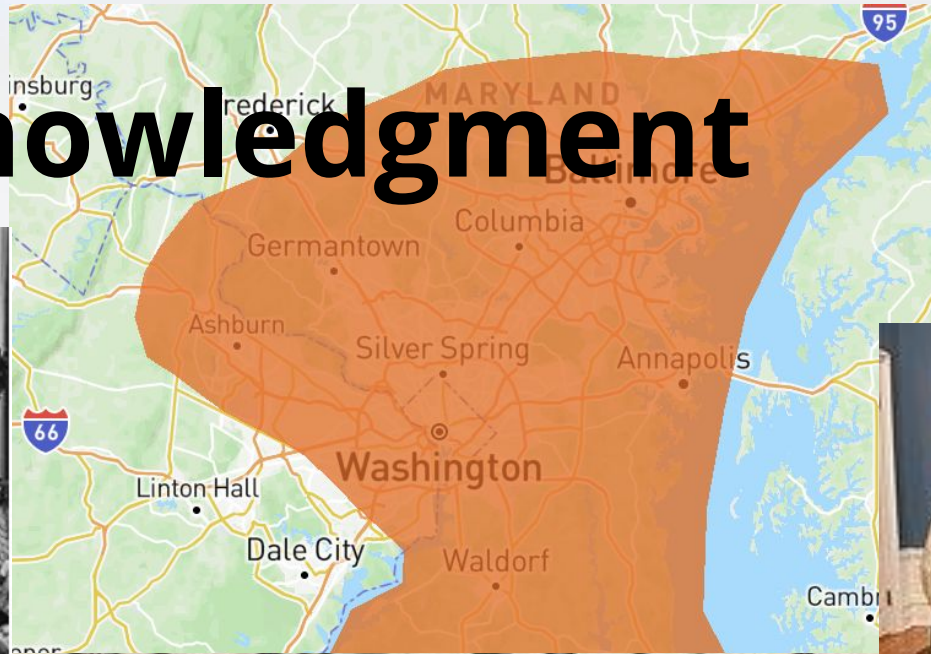

Eligibility

Education	<i>Master's degree</i> (or higher graduate-level degree) from an accredited institution of higher education in a higher education/student affairs focus or a non-student affairs field.	<i>Bachelor's or associate's degree</i> from an accredited institution of higher education.
Qualifying Employment Experience	Minimum total of <i>five (5) years</i> (measured as 60 months) of full-time student affairs or services-related work experience	Minimum total of <i>seven (7) years</i> (measured as 84 months) of full-time student affairs or services-related work experience

Exam: Overview

- **Focus:** Designed to measure candidate's performance against the level of knowledge and competency in established domains that can be reasonably expected of mid-level student affairs educators, including within six specific functional areas.
- **Development:** Engaged over 130 SMEs in item development, review, and determining passing scores
- **Format:** quantitative, multiple choice, including scenarios
- **Maintenance:** annual psychometric analysis

Exam: Type & Preparation

- Core: 150 questions (Three hour maximum)
- Specialty: 50 questions (Two hour maximum)
- Occur entirely online with live proctor
- Content outlines available in Candidate Handbook
- Suggested resources for Core exam on website

Exam: Results

- Confidential
- Total passing score and individual score
- Feedback on domains to inform professional development (and potential exam retake)
- Ability to join online registry of certificants
- Certificate and Digital Badge

Code of Ethics

- **Guiding Principles:** Overall objectives
- **Goals:** Aspirational guideposts pertaining to the profession, higher ed individuals, students and others
- **Obligations:** requirements to meet and behavior to avoid

Continuing Education

- Certification maintained through continuing education and ethical practice
- Core Recertification: 50 CEs in five years (8 of which must be social justice and inclusion-focused)
- Specialty Recertification: Additional 50 CEs in respective specialty area
- Continuing education will include in-person, online, and recorded educational content provided by associations and institutions

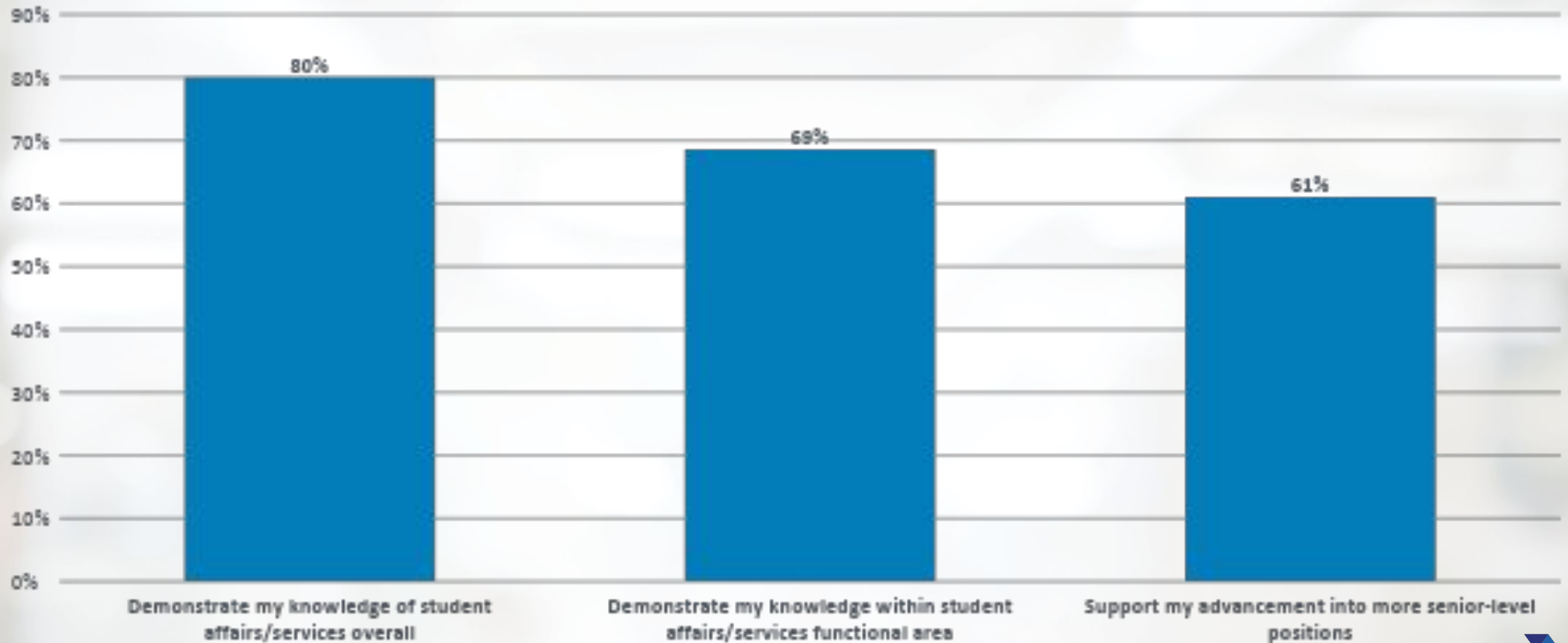
